

WEDNESDAY 1 VIRTUAL BIENNIAL

SLOVENIA: Sarah Deacon in Ljubljana

Thank God for fruitful meetings with teenage girls within the church. I am especially thankful for the studies I have with a woman who became a Christian recently. Please pray for the coronavirus situation here: as we border Italy there is a real danger of a large outbreak. A youth conference was due to happen in March but was cancelled due to restrictions against gatherings of over 100 people. Please pray that the work would continue and that we would keep trusting God.
